## SUPPLY LIST:

**TO DO BEFORE CLASS:** Find an orphan block in your stash, preferably between 8" – 12".

**IF** you do not have an orphan block that contains a **Printed** fabric you Love, then please make an 8" block (Free Pattern Attached) using a print that speaks to you. Medium Prints work the best and the more details, the better it will be for inspiration.

## **Additional Fabric Requirements:**

\_\_\_ A FQ of a coordinating (to your block) fabric that reads as solid for borders.

\_\_\_ 2-3 coordinating FQs for design expansion to borders (prints and/or solids).

## **Assemble the following list for Class:**

SEWING MACHINE with manual and BASIC SEWING SUPPLIES

### **Plus:**

- Machine needles
- Rotary Cutter, mat (12" x 18" is fine), ruler 6" x 24" (minimum of 3" x 18")
- Threads to match fabrics for sewing assembly and applique

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FABRIC COLLABORATION

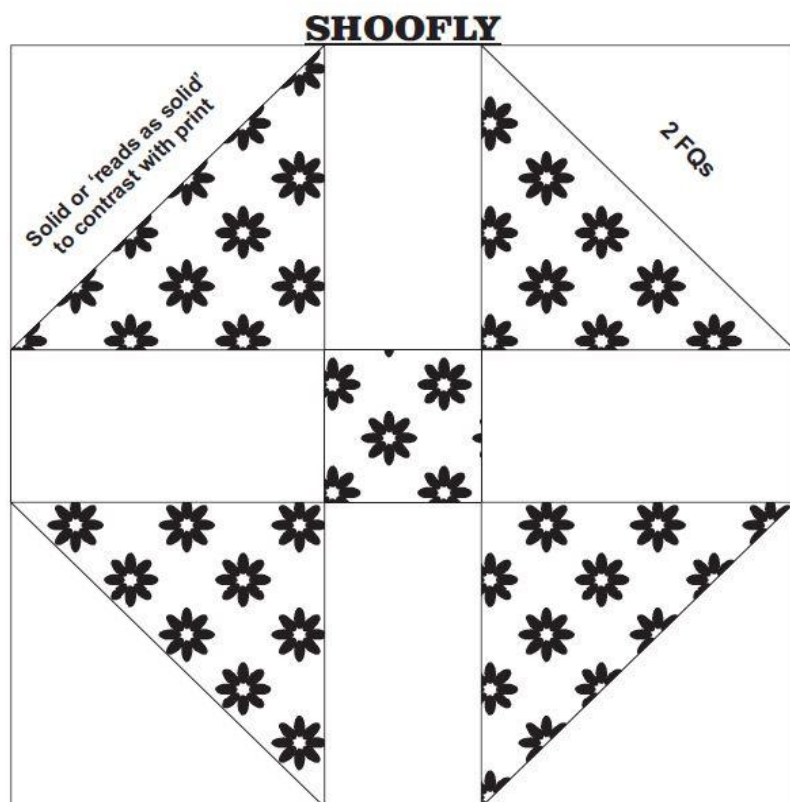
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SEWING SUPPLIES CONTINUED:

- 12 wt. Sulky thread to match fabrics for Embroidery details (hand or machine)
- Scissors: fabric and paper
- Pen, pencil (preferably mechanical), white chalk pencil for dark fabrics, and eraser
- Pins
- Glue stick
- ½ yard of paper-backed fusible web if doing machine applique

IF you own already, please bring a Hera marker and a Sewing Tracing Wheel



From solid fabric, Cut 2 squares @ 4" and 4 rectangles @ 2" x 3 1/2".

From print fabric, Cut 2 squares @ 4" and 1 square @ 2".

Place a solid and print fabric square right sides together and draw a diagonal line from corner to corner on wrong side of lighter fabric. Sew 1/4" to either side of drawn line. Cut apart on the drawn line for 2 half-square triangles. Repeat with second solid and print squares. Press to darker fabric and trim both to 3-1/2".

Following diagram above and with a scant 1/4" seam allowance, sew a 2" x 3-1/2" solid rectangle between 2 half square triangles as shown above. Press to print. Make 2. Sew a 2" print square between 2 solid 2" x 3-1/2" rectangles as shown above. Press to print. Make 1. Assemble the block, pinning at intersections, as shown above. Press toward solid rectangles. Blocks measure 8". (Finishes at 7-1/2").
