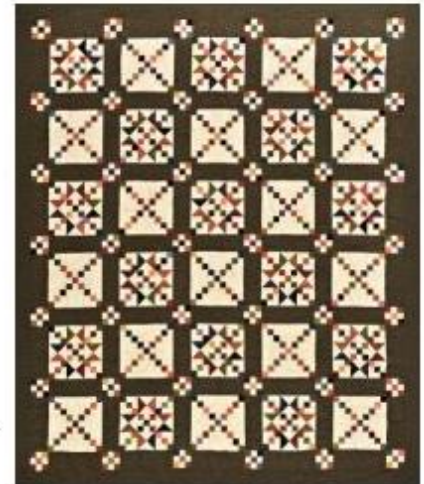




Mercantile Nine Patch ~ Class Supply List

Welcome to the *Mercantile Nine Patch* workshop!! You won't believe how easy and fun this quilt is to make because of strip sets! Choose one background fabric, and a bunch of different prints in your favorite color(s). Then, follow the fabric preparation directions and cutting instructions. I'm really looking forward to meeting you soon!!



★Preparations:

* I highly recommend preparing your fabrics with spray sizing!! This step is optional, but will be an enormous help with every step of piecing. Thoroughly and evenly spray, saturating your fabric yardage before cutting!! Air dry or press it dry with a dry iron. I use Faultless Magic Light Hold spray sizing in the blue & white can available at Walmart, Target, and grocery stores. You will need several cans.

- ⇒ *After sizing your fabrics cut your entire quilt following the cutting directions below. It will be very helpful to sort, label and bag the pieces for the Double Nine Patch blocks, and Nine Patch Star blocks, as it will help immensely with assembly.

★Fabrics & Cutting Instructions:

- ♥ (1) 10" x 10" precut of Prairie Dry Goods fabric collection OR (39) 10" squares of assorted medium/dark prints.
- ♥ 6" x 22" EACH of (9) assorted medium and/or dark prints for Quarter Square Triangles in Star blocks.
- ♥ 3 1/3 yard of light print for background in all blocks.
- ♥ 3 3/4 yards dark print for sashing, border and binding.
- ♥ 5 yards for backing.

↻ Cutting Instructions ↻

It will be very useful to sort and label the pieces as you cut them as it will help immensely with assembly.

✂ From **EACH** of (39) dark print 10" x 10" prints for blocks:

- *Cut (1) 1 1/2" x 10" strip for strip set A.
- *Cut (1) 1 1/2" x 10" strip for strip set B.
- *Cut (1) 1 1/2" x 10" strip for strip set C.

From the remaining fabrics, choose (9) different prints, and from each

- *Cut (1) 1 1/2" x 10" strip for strip set A.

From the remaining fabrics, choose (1) different print, and

- *Cut (1) 1 1/2" x 10" strip for strip set C.

- ✂ From EACH of (9) dark prints for Quarter Square Triangles:
*Cut (4) 4½" x 4½" squares ~ subcut twice diagonally ☒
(6 squares extra unused in the quilt)
- ✂ From light print for blocks:
*Cut (4) 4½" x WOF strips ~ subcut (30) 4½" x 4½" squares ~ subcut twice diagonally ☒ for Quarter Square Triangles in Double Nine Patch Star blocks.
*Cut (6) 3½" x WOF strips ~ subcut (60) 3½" x 3½" squares for Double Nine Patch blocks.
*Cut (10) 2½" x WOF strips ~ subcut (40) 2½" x 10" strips for strip set C.
*Cut (6) 1½" x WOF strips ~ subcut (24) 1½" x 10" strips for strip set A.
*Cut (20) 1½" x WOF strips ~ subcut (78) 1½" x 10" strips for strip set B.
- ✂ From dark print for sashing, border and binding:
*Cut (8) 9½" x WOF strips ~ subcut (71) 9½" x 3½" sashing strips.
*Cut (8) 3" x WOF strips for borders.
*Cut (8) 2¼" x WOF strips for binding.
- ✂ From backing fabric:
*Cut (2) 2½ yard pieces.

★Supplies You'll Need:

Mercantile Nine Patch pattern by Heartspun Quilts (required & available the day of class), click style pencil, basic sewing supplies, sewing machine in good working order, quarter inch foot for your machine, rotary cutter and medium size mat.

Please bring a 3½" square and 9½" square or larger square ruler (I recommend Creative Grid rulers.) *Optional but very helpful*are a 3½" x 12½" Creative Grid ruler, Tucker Trimmer I ruler, Acorn Seam Align glue, and a small bottle of Best Press starch only if you starched your fabric prior to cutting it as recommended.
