**Description:**

Miss Carrie McGavock lived in Franklin, Tennessee, at Carnton Plantation. Her land was the sight of one of the bloodiest battles in the Civil War. Her home was used as a field hospital. The dead were buried in a cemetery at the fringes of her property. She cared for thousands of graves until the day she died. This quilt is symbolic of her sacrifices as she cared for others.

**Materials:**

- 5 ½ yards total for geese and crosses. You may use fat quarters or fat eights to total this amount. The more variety the better.
- 4 ¼ yards for background
- 2 yard for setting triangles
- 1 yard for both inner borders
- 1 ¾ yards for outer border
- ¾ yard for binding.

I highly recommend the Creative Grid flying goose ruler to make your geese. It leaves little to no waste and makes perfect geese every time.

Sewing machine, quarter inch foot, thread, rotary cutter, ruler, mat, pins, marking device, etc.
