Description:

Using strip sets and your regular ruler, you will learn the tricks for matching a 60/30-degree seam. This quilt will help you perfect your 60/30 degree piecing and matching of points. It is a great skill to have in your sewing arsenal. Pattern is included with this class. Cutting your strips before class insures you will get a lot completed.

I recommend starching all fabric before cutting as these will be exposed bias cuts until sewn. Starching helps to minimize stretching.

Blocks: 63 Diamond Four-Patch Blocks

Materials

- 22-26 (3.25 X wof) strips for pieced diamonds
- 3 ½ yards of setting fabrics for setting diamonds
- 1 yard for border partial diamonds

Cutting

Measurements include ¼” seam allowance

From setting fabric, cut:

16 (6” wide) strips

From border partial diamond fabric, cut:

3 (3.75” wide) strips.

3 (6.25” wide) strips

Supplies:

Sewing machine, quarter inch foot, pins, rotary cutter, mat, thread, a ruler with 60 and 30 degree lines on it. Most of the basic rectangular rulers have this. If you have a 60/30-degree ruler, you can use that but it is not necessary.
