### **Description:**

Let's make a fun bag together! You'll learn several ways to install zippers and pockets.

**Materials fee:** \$12 for printed pattern. \$20 for optional kit in lieu of supply list (fabric selections will vary)

### **Supply list (please bring to class):**

- Sewing Machine
- Thread and loaded bobbins to match your fabric
- Notions typical to machine sewing:
  - scissors (4" or longer blades)
  - pins (normal quilting pins)
  - seam ripper
- Notebook and pen for note taking
- Main Fabric: 1 1/4 yard of 44-inch-wide fabric
- Lining Fabric: 3/4 yard of 44-inch-wide fabric
- Batting (any thickness): TWO 14 x 14 inch pieces
- Zipper for interior pocket: One 12-inch-long zipper (all purpose)
- Interfacing: 1 1/4 yard of iron-on or sew-in (usually 20 inches wide)
- A note about interfacing: This bag can be as soft or as rigid as you prefer. You will want to take into consideration how much thickness and stiffness your sewing machine can handle.
- For a light, soft, bag, I recommend just an iron-on (fusible) interfacing. It sews easily and adds very little bulk. For a stiffer bag, you can use Wonder Under (sandwiched between your main fabric and another, unseen, fabric), Pellon Peltex, or a heavy duty sew-in interfacing, or just batting. The front and the back of the bag are quilted, so you will need batting for those pieces.
