**Description:**

This no y-seam pattern is a modern take on a hexagon quilt. Science Fair takes hexagons and makes them simple with no y-seams. It's a fun project. Let's go!

**Supplies**

- Pattern Science Fair by Jaybird Quilts Please let me know if you need the pattern and they may be purchased from me the day of class. \$12.00
- Hex-n-More ruler by Jaybird quilts. I will have these in class by request or you may bring your own. \$24.00. If you choose not to purchase, you may make templates from an 8X10" piece of template plastic.
- To make a baby size of this quilt as my sample, you will need one jelly roll or 42 2.5" strips. To make colorized as on the cover of the pattern, you will need 20 2.5" strips and one yard of background. I recommend starching all of your fabrics as we will be cutting across the bias of our strips.
- Bias cut binding ¾ yard
- Standard sewing supplies: machine, quarter inch foot, thread, scissors or snips, pins, rotary cutter and mat, etc.
