**Description:**

Squares are stacked then sub-cut into pieces. The squares can be sub-cut following a detailed cutting diagram, or the diagram can be used simply as a suggestion as you create your own liberated design. You decide! Who knew cutting fabric pieces willy nilly could be soooo much fun! Gather your pile of squares and join me for a fabric whacking good time!

Finished Size: 73 ½” x 82”

Fabric Requirements and Cutting Instructions:

10” squares of fabric for block construction

28 Medium/Dark squares and 28 Light Squares

Accent Fabric 1 yard

- First Border - 7 strips 1 ½”x wof
- Binding 8 strips 2” x wof

Final Border 2 ¼ yards

**Supply List**

- Pattern: Provided by Brenda
- Sewing Machine
- Thread to blend with fabrics - dark grey or khaki work well
- Cutting Mat - rotating is helpful
- Finger Presser
- Ruler - a 14” ruler for the sub-cuts
- 9” square ruler for squaring up blocks
- Freezer Paper - 8 - 10 11” squares – Optional
- Rotary Cutter
- Scissors
- Seam Ripper
- Pins

**Fabric Note:**

I highly recommend you starch your fabric squares for the best results! The product I use is StaFlo liquid starch that I mix 50/50 with water. Spray it on my fabric to saturate it and then air dry. I press with a steam iron after it has dried.
